# Financial Aid

---

All students, regardless of family income, should apply for financial aid to help cover their college expenses. Financial aid is available through both federal and state funding. To be eligible for aid, students must have a financial need, receive a high school diploma or GED, or pass an independently administered test approved by the U.S. Department of Education. Students also need to be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.

Financial aid eligibility is the difference between the cost of education and the Expected Family Contribution (EFC). A federal formula performs a needs analysis to determine the EFC. The cost of education includes tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, transportation and miscellaneous expenses.

Students are expected to contribute money from savings, summer and school year earnings, or obtain loans to pay college expenses. Parents are expected to contribute from their income and assets. The student's "need" is the cost of education for one academic year, minus the expected contribution from the student and parents. Colleges and universities attempt to meet all or most of the student's "need" by putting together a financial aid package made up of federal, state, school and private sources, as well as loans, grants and work study.

In August 1993, Congress amended the Higher Education Act creating the new direct lending program as well as minor changes in the financial aid application process.

## How to Apply For Financial Aid

---

1. **Fill out the FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as soon as possible after January 1. Early submission maximizes a student's chances of receiving aid, as late applicants receive aid on a "funds available" basis. Students can find FAFSA online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). For PIN information, visit: [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). Filing a FAFSA electronically is much faster than filing a paper FAFSA. The process may be as much as 7-14 days faster if you electronically sign your application using your PIN. Also, FAFSA on the web edits the application prior to submitting it to Federal Student Aid, which significantly reduces the number of errors on the application.

You can get a paper FAFSA from the Federal Student Aid Information Center by calling 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243). A PDF of the application is also available at [www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov](http://www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov).

Financial aid offices use information from the FAFSA to determine eligibility for federal student aid from grants, loans and work-study programs. Students should fill out the FAFSA every year even if they do not think they will qualify for aid.

2. **Students will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR)** after the FAFSA is processed. Your submitted information is also sent to the college(s) named on the FAFSA. If the student does not receive a SAR or needs another copy, they should call 1-800-433-3243 for a duplicate SAR. **NOTE:** It is the student's responsibility to check for and correct errors on their SAR forms.

3. **The student's selected College Financial Aid Office(s) will send an award letter** to the student indicating the types of aid the student is eligible to receive.
4. **Students should check with the college(s)** they expect to attend as additional applications/forms may be required for financial aid.

#### 5. **PROFILE**

This supplementary form is made available to high schools along with the FAFSA. Some colleges and universities require a completed Profile form in addition to the FAFSA before a financial aid package can be determined. Students should consult with the Financial Aid Office of the school of their choice to find out if the supplementary form is necessary.

**NOTE:** Special circumstances (such as changes in income and other factors affecting eligibility) may be considered. Should special circumstances arise, the student should submit a letter of explanation to the Financial Aid Office at the school of their choice.

## **Federal and State Programs**

---

- Pell Grant  
Pell grants are the foundation of need-based student aid, and eligibility is determined by information provided in the FAFSA. For 2008-2009, the maximum yearly Federal Pell Grant was \$4,731. The maximum Pell Grant annual allowance will increase from \$4,731 to \$5,350 for the 2009-2010 school year. Grant amounts vary with expected family contribution, the cost of education at a student's chosen school and student status. - Perkins Loan  
The college acts as a lender with funds provided by the federal government. The criteria for selection includes need and fund availability.

Students can borrow up to \$5,500 for each year of undergraduate study.

Repayments begin nine months after students graduate or their status drops to less than half time, with up to 10 years to repay.

- Work-Study Program  
Makes available jobs on and off campus with hourly wages paid directly to the student to help pay for education expenses. Students earn at least the current federal minimum wage and could earn more depending on the job and the skills required.
- Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant Program (SEOG)  
This program is for students of exceptional financial need, who without the grant would be unable to continue their education. The SEOG is awarded through the financial aid office of the school you plan to attend. The SEOG is not an entitlement program; that is, there are no guarantees attached to it. Each school receives a set amount of money to use for SEOGs. When the money is gone, there are no more SEOGs awarded for that year.
- Stafford Loan  
Formerly called Guaranteed Student Loans. Repayment begins six months after student graduates, withdraws from school or status drops to less than half time. Students with financial need receive subsidized Stafford loans – the federal government pays the interest while students are in school and during deferments. The maximum annual award is \$3,500 to \$5,500 depending on grade level for independent undergraduate students.
- Unsubsidized Stafford Loan  
A program available to undergraduates who do not demonstrate financial need. Same interest and repayment terms as Federal Stafford, except interest is not subsidized and will accrue during in-school and six-month grace periods. Students have the option of either paying the interest as it accrues on the loan or capitalizing the interest and paying it off along with the principal following graduation.

For loans first disbursed on or after July 1, 2008, the interest rate is 6.0 percent for subsidized Stafford Loans for undergraduate students and 6.8 percent for unsubsidized Stafford loans for undergraduate and graduate students.

- Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS)  
Parents can borrow the entire cost of their students' education, less financial aid. Generally repayment of PLUS loans must begin within 60 days after the loan is fully disbursed. Federal PLUS loans carry a fixed interest rate of 7.9 percent or 8.5 percent for loans first disbursed on or after July 1, 2006.

### **Important!**

#### Selective Service Notice

To receive any form of federally funded financial aid, such as Pell grants, supplemental grants, work-study, and loans, male students must have proof that they have registered with the Selective Service. ## **Scholarships**

---

Each year private organizations, corporations, fraternal groups, clubs and labor unions provide funds for students to complete their education. Most scholarships are based upon both achievement and need, but other scholarships are based primarily on scholastic achievement and school/community involvement. Students are encouraged to apply for all scholarships for which they are eligible.
